17. Per Diem Worksheet

1. Call to Order

Chair Narjes called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Wittrock reviewed various items listed in the accounts payable. 6. Director and Staff Reports

Kaiser, Davis, Keller, Reisdorff, Glanz, Sanders, Hruska, and McMillen all submitted written reports. Wittrock reviewed meetings he has attended such as the Legislative Conference and meetings he will be attending such as the Sidney Watershed Coalition meeting. The District is working with NRCS on source water wellhead protection on a shared position that would be shared between the three panhandle NRDs. He and Davis have worked with Rauner & Associates on cleaning up some accounts in QuickBooks.

7. Preliminary Robust Review Update

Kuntz reviewed the robust review pointing out some changes to the South Platte Valley subarea where the comingled acres under Western Canal were identified incorrectly and the subsequent adjustment gave accretions to the subarea bringing it to a positive result regarding the Robust Review. Discussion followed.

8. Agency Reports

A. <u>USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service</u> (NRCS)

1. NRCS Report

Dickinson stated that there were a couple of items in the board packet and encouraged the Directors to look at those items. NRCS staff has been working on CSP and EQIP obligations with ranking applications and moved over to contracts. It is a tight schedule to get this done. They were working on interviews for the Pheasants Forever biologist position. Those have been completed and no candidate was picked. The position has been put on hold for hiring due to potential government funding issues. The Local Work Group meeting is scheduled for March 19 at 10 a.m. at the District conference room.

B. Nebraska Association of Resources Districts

1. NARD Report

Johnson stated that there are changes coming to the executive committee at NARD. The ACE camp will be held at Burwell Nebraska. The state Envirothon will be at Ponca State Park. The conference was well attended.

2. 2024 NARD Legislative Conference Report

Wittrock stated that the state legislation bills that are being followed are being provided to the directors. Rutt discussed the statewide Mesonet that is being planned to track weather across the state.

3. 2024 Legislative Session

Wittrock discussed bills the NARD is following including LB1414 and LB1415 which relate to the property tax limits and could directly affect NRDs. Both bills are in committee at this time.

C. Nebraska Department of Natural Resources (NeDNR)

1. <u>NeDNR Report Natural Resources Commission (NRC)</u> No report.

9. General Reports

A. Oliver Reservoir Report

Kaiser stated that the public meeting for Oliver Reservoir was held last week. 13 people showed up. There were two agenda items including charging for camping at Oliver Reservoir and then a

general comments item. 12 of the 13 in attendance voted yes to charging for camping and limiting the number of days for camping. Donations currently only cover around 50% of the expenses for Oliver Reservoir. Kaiser will bring the issue to the board at the March board meeting. Discussion followed. Other items discussed include putting dumpsters out, cattails on the inlet clogging the flow of water into the reservoir, and an issue with one of the boat docks.

10. Committee Reports

- A. Natural Resources Projects and Programs Committee Meyer, Chair
 - 1. *Discussion and Action on Application to Transfer Ground Water from Derry Farms, Inc. to KFKV Farms, Inc.

Meyer reviewed the ground water transfer request from Derry Farms, Inc. to KFKV Farms, Inc. The transfer application meets all the rules and regulations. The transfer application request is for 4,800-acre inches. Meyer moved to approve the application to transfer ground water from Derry Farms, Inc. to KFKV Farms, Inc. A second was made by Sprenger and with no further discussion a roll call vote was taken.

2. *Discussion and Action on Application to Transfer Ground Water from Derry Farms, Inc. to Floyd Derry Farms, Inc.

Meyer reviewed the ground water transfer request from Derry Farms, Inc. to Floyd Derry Farms, Inc. The transfer application meets all the rules and regulations. The transfer application request is for 7,200-acre inches. Meyer moved to approve the application to transfer ground water from Derry Farms, Inc. to Floyd Derry Farms, Inc. A second was made by Rutt and with no further discussion a roll call vote was taken.

3. *Discussion and Action on Pooling Arrangement Application

Glanz reviewed the application for the pooling arrangement between Steve McClung and McClung Farms and Gary Kanter. The application meets all of the rules and is in a floating township and meets the 50% usage rule. Meyer moved to approve the pooling arrangement agreement between McClung Farms Inc. and Gary Kanter. A second was made by Maas and with no further discussion a roll call vote was taken.

5. <u>Process and Timeline Regarding Possible changes to the SPNRD GWMA Rules and</u> Regulations

Wittrock reviewed the proposed timeline pointing out the potential changes to the timeline depending on when NeDNR will present the results of the Robust Review. The timeline could be moved back two months depending on the Robust Review meeting. The Countywide meetings will be held March 20th and 21st regardless of the timing of the Robust Review meeting. Wittrock then reviewed the agenda of the Countywide meetings. Discussion followed.

Narjes reviewed the members of the District Operations Committee. The current members are Johnson, Halligan and Narjes. It was decided to move Halligan to the committee chair to replace Narjes.

Narjes reviewed the members of the Natural Resources/Projects and Programs Committee. Rutt, Sprenger, Maas and Meyer are the current members with Meyer being the chair. No changes were made to this committee.

Wittrock encouraged the board members to review the information provided in the correspondence. He then stated that if NeDNR is going to review the Robust Review then the March 2024 Board Meeting may need to be moved to March 13 from March 12.
