

2022 FISCAL YEAR SPNRD BUDGET APPROVED

The Board of Directors voted to approve the 2022 fiscal year budget during the board meeting Tuesday, September 14. The tax rate was set to an increase of 3.02% for the fiscal year of 2022. The 2021 fiscal year tax asking was \$1,209,730. The 2022 fiscal year tax asking is \$1,261,689; an increase of \$51,959. For a \$100,000 valued home, this is a tax rate of \$50.36, where previously in fiscal year 2021, it was \$48.88 in property taxes.

Oliver Reservoir Recreation Area (ORRA) Is located 8 miles west of Kimball on Hwy 30. and is managed by SPNRD. 2021 has brought campers from all over the United States. All donations made to ORRA are utilized to upgrade the recreation area and to make it more user friendly for all people. 78% of all donations are from travelers out of state. Some updates that have been made include but are not limited to new entrance signs, a new dump station, over 40 new trees planted to provide more shade, the handicap accessible ramp will be repaired in Spring of 2022,S and new registration envelopes. HIGH TUNNEL WORKSHOP HOSTED AT FANNY'S FRUIT FARM



Beth Kokjer, owner of Fanny's Fruit Farms is one of many in the SPNRD who is looking for more effecient ways of growing crops. Utilizing the High Tunnel Green House, Kokjer has been able to extend her growing season and reduce her carbon foot print. However, it was not always this easy. After the first few years of the High Tunnel System, she would find her crop becoming damaged from the heat. Her High tunnel greenhouse was producing temperatures up to 115 degrees. After several years of trying different tactics to keep the temperature from rising, Kokjer has finally figured out a way to stabilize the temperature and to keep her crop from burning up. This 2021 growing season was a successful

year of the high tunnel and Kokjer wants to encourage anyone considering using a High Tunnel to take the leap. Kokjer utilized the Natural Resources and Conservation Services (NRCS) to help with the funding of the High Tunnel which is available through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). High tunnels have a variety of benefits, these include but are not limited to, longer growing seasons, preventing direct rainfall on the plants and utilizing drip irrigation to provide more effecient water delivery, pest control, and pollen and pesticide drift. High Tunnels are beginning to gain popularity and Kokjer wants to offer a lunch and learn to provide information on what worked and what didn't with the High Tunnel Green House.
