


BUDGET APPROVED

At the September board meeting, the Board of Directors voted to approve the District's budget of \$2.5 million and signed a resolution for setting the final property tax request at \$1,300,569. The approved tax rate (levy) of \$.049950 per \$100 of assessed value is .81% lower than last year's tax rate of \$.050360/\$100 of assessed value. The SPNRD budget is combined with Oliver Reservoir Recreation Area (ORRA) and Clean Harbors Environmental Services Inc. (CHESI) Committee. Sources and percentages for Revenue and Expenses are shown on the chart. A copy of the proposed budget was public noticed in the Sidney Telegraph, Chappell Register and Western Nebraska Observer the week of August 28th. 


CONSERVATION TREE SEASON

Our 2023 tree orders will be accepted October 2022 through March 2023. Three rootstock are available: Bare Root, Hefty Root, and Hefty Root Plus. What's new? We have added two trees to our inventory, Swiss Stone Pine and Quaking Aspen.

Swiss Stone Pine is a dense, conical growth, drought tolerant tree with blue-green needles. It is native to the mountains of Europe and Asia. Heights will range from 10-12' tall at maturity. We've had success with these trees in the past. Quantities are extremely limited. Offered in hefty root plus only.

Quaking Aspen grow rapidly and will tolerate a wide range of soil conditions, but has high moisture requirements. These trees come from North Dakota and can grow up to 25-60' tall. A suitable substitute for cottonwood if spacing is limited. Leaf scorch can be an issue with our hot, dry summers. Offered in hefty root only.
